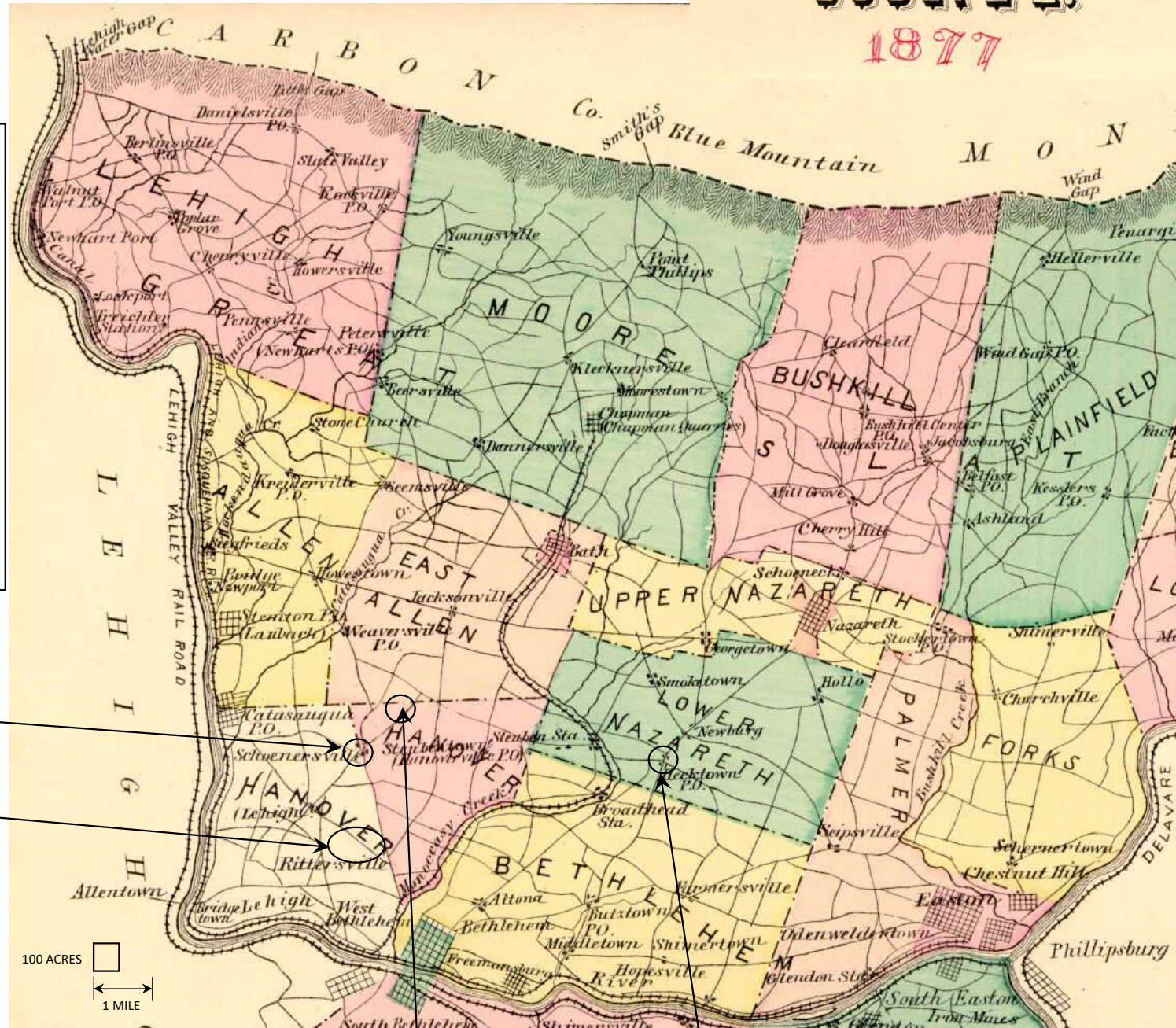


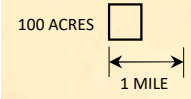
EARLY BRADER FARMS ~1770 - 1820

- 1812 Lehigh county formed out of Northampton county
- 1746 Bethlehem township formed
- 1788 Nazareth township formed out of Bethlehem township
- 1807 Lower Nazareth township and Upper Nazareth townships formed out of Nazareth township
- 1752 Allen township formed
- 1798 Hanover township formed out of Allen township
- 1812 Hanover township, Lehigh co formed out of Hanover township, Northampton co
- 1842 East Allen township formed out of Allen township

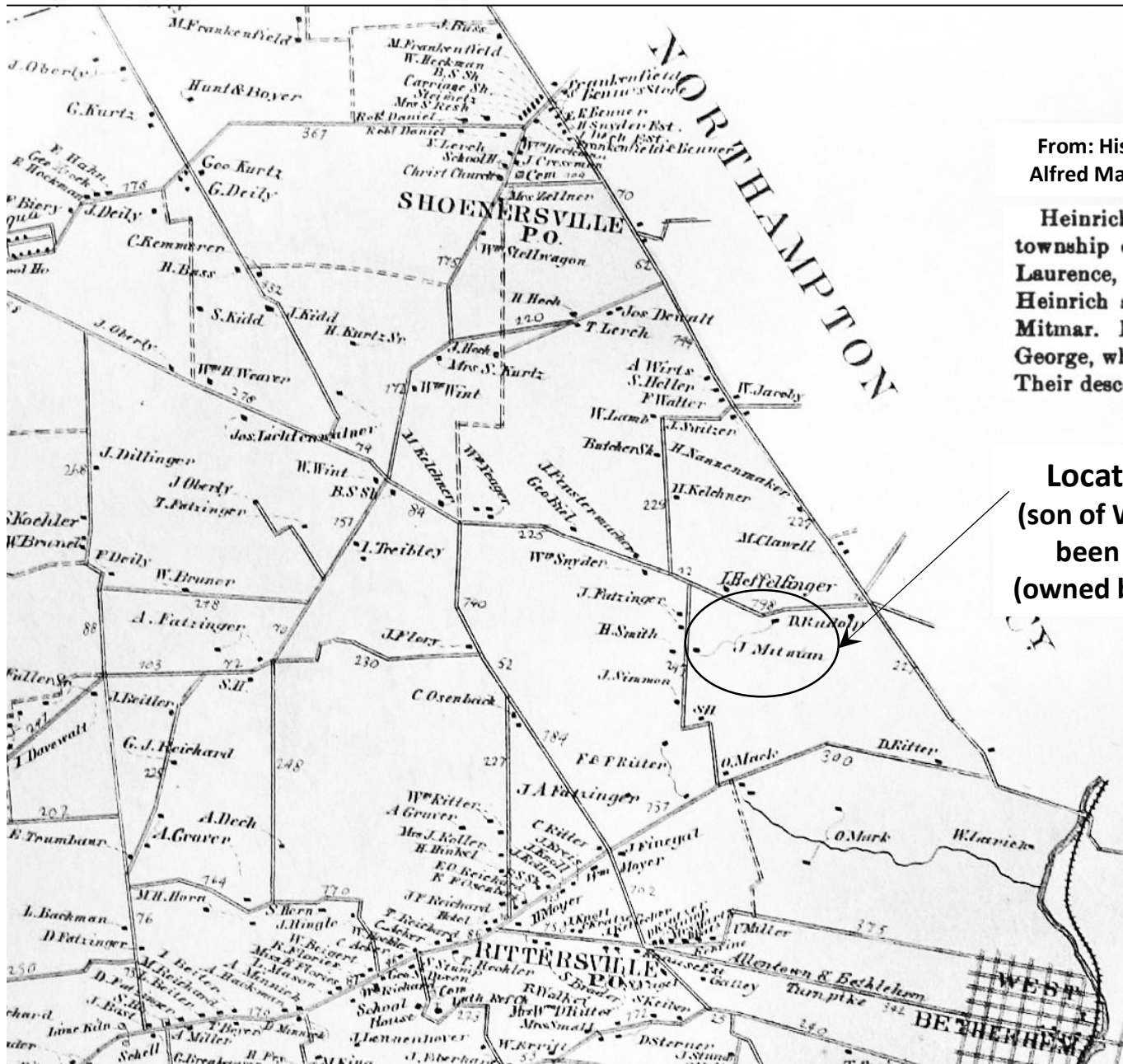

Heinrich Brader was an early settler in the present township of Hanover, and his brothers, Philip and Laurence, in Hanover and Northampton County. Heinrich settled on the farm now owned by John Mitmar. He had sons, among whom were Daniel and George, who settled on the homestead and near there. Their descendants are in different parts of the county.
